- And more!


Throughout the Challenge, you will find printables to use alongside your study that include Scripture look-up, prayer requests, reflection questions, your weekly action steps and a devotional.

That's when I figured I am probably not the only one who struggles with this and the Keep Quiet Challenge was beginning to form in my heart and mind. As much for me as for you – maybe more!

I plan to get very raw with you. I am not going to lie; I have selfish motives for doing the Keep Quiet Challenge – I desperately NEED it. I don't think I am the only one because you are here too!

Jeannette's Introduction

Sometimes I wonder why struggles seamlessly come my way, then other times, I wonder how God even puts up with me in the manner with which I choose to respond to those struggles. Quite frankly, I am tired of myself and I don't know how He isn't. I am tired of fighting, getting me nowhere. I am tired of sinning with my mouth, then regretting it almost instantly afterward.

I have been with my husband for 14 years. Much of that time we have spent at odds with each other. We met at church, and the truth is, only a month after we were married everything changed; he was not the man I throught I had married.

I spent so much time resenting him for that, feeling deceived yet again by someone I trusted. The more I realized who he was, the more I argued and pushed him even further away.

Challenge One: Tame Your Tone of Voice!

I often feel like my mind is moving a million miles a second. I have so many thoughts and ideas, and any type of interruption to my thoughts is often met with an *unintentional* irritated tone of voice.

When I started working on and praying for the Keep Quiet Challenge, I started to observe other moms around me. I saw how they interacted with their children and responded to their husbands. I recall thinking on numerous occasions, "are they always so sweet and patient in their responses?"

Maybe yes, maybe no. We all put on our best performances when around other people, right?

Has anyone ever told you they want to record you so you can listen to how you actually sound? My husband has, on numerous occasions (thankfully he has never followed through!).

The truth is, most often I am not upset or even in a bad mood; I just happen to have a sharp tone of voice. I am a very matter-of-fact, to-the-point, tell-it-like-it-is kind of person. That can be good sometimes, but not all the time, and definitely not in my everyday speech.

There are many reasons we might become snappy and speak with a sharp tone, but that doesn't make it okay. I know this; I need to learn how to tame my tone of voice.

Challenge One Action Steps:

- Take a moment before you respond to make sure you are not responding rashly.
- Breathe before answering or making a request.
- Clear your mind of your recent thoughts so you are not still thinking about them when you respond.
- Focus on being kind with your words

Weekly Devotion: Anxious Hearts and Fiery Tones

Read over our devotion for Challenge One, written by Bonnie Rose Hudson and answer the following application questions.

Luke 10:38-42 ESV

Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to His teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to Him and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

I have always loved the story of Mary and Martha, as I imagine many of us have. My default behavior is much more Martha than Mary. Martha was focused on everything that needed done, and she was probably fearful it would not be accomplished—or accomplished to her satisfaction. So, she hustled and bustled, worried and fretted, all the time missing the most incredible of wonders. The Lord was in her home.

I always cringe a little when I hear her question to the Lord. I wish she would have said, "Lord, could You please tell Mary to help me out?" That would not have been the best question to ask, but it would have been better than her fiery question. "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone?"

"Do You not care?" Of course, we know the answer. No One in the universe ever cared for Martha more than Jesus did. No One could know her heart and cherish her the way He did. And yet, she asks Him if she cares. But that's what worry does. It leads us to question if the Lord truly cares.

One of my favorite stories in the entire Bible is the story of Mary and Martha when their brother Lazarus died. I love it for many reasons, but one of them is because we see Martha learned from her missteps and from the Lord. In John 11:27, she declares to Him that she believes He is the Messiah, the Savior of the world. In John 11:39-41, we see her trusting in Jesus's care for her completely, doing what was certainly unexpected and very much against the social norms. She ordered her brother's grave be opened because Jesus said so.

Martha took her eyes off herself and put them on Jesus. Focus fuels faith and extinguishes fiery tones.
